Contest materials will be delivered to teachers early in January of 2023. Test components may be administered at a time at the discretion of the teacher, within a specified time period. While reading and listening components do not have to be administered the same day, all students within a school must write each component at the same time. No student shall be allowed to write a section the rest of the class has already written.

Testing will take place January 11-18th. All materials need to be in the MGLC Committee's possession by January 27.

Top students will be invited to participate in the MGLC Finals at Chief Peguis School on Monday, February 13, 2023 between 4:30 and 8 p.m.

CATEGORY DEFINITION – RULES

All eligible students must be enrolled in a Manitoba public or private school during this school year and must be participating in a German program (including German Saturday School and Distance Education courses). Any other enrolments will be at the discretion of the committee. While the MGLC Committee wishes that all students could be included, our categories do not suit all students. Please contact us should you have questions.

Student will enter into different categories based on age and qualifications.

Junior Category - grades 7 and 8

Intermediate Category - grade 9 and 10

Senior Category - grade 11 and 12

Within each age category, student will be divided into the following categories:

CATEGORY A: You must enter this category if any of the following apply:

- Students who have learned German in a German school system (e.g. Paraguay) and have entered Canada before the age of 8.
- **Students attending the German Bilingual Program**
- Students whose immediate family speaks High German in the home

CATEGORY B: You must enter this category if any of the following apply:

- Students whose parents speak a form of German dialect (Low German, Hutterian dialect, etc.) in the home and students who take basic/core German (excluding the German Bilingual Program)
- Students who were registered in the Bilingual Program more than 3 years ago, but are currently registered in basic/core German or German Saturday School. They must enter category A for the first 3 years following their enrolment in the German Bilingual Program and may then drop down to category B.

CATEGORY C: You must enter this category if any of the following apply:

- Students in whose home no German (High, Low, or any other dialect) is spoken
- Students who were formerly registered in the Bilingual Program after the age of 8 may not enter Category C

CATEGORY D:

- Students who have attended a German school system in another country and have arrived in Canada after the age of 8.

Only students with Canadian passports are eligible to win a scholarship trip. Students who have previously won any of the senior scholarship trips to Germany are not eligible to enter the contest again.

Any teacher who has questions about the categorization of a student, should contact the committee. The MGLC Committee reserves the right to rule on controversial matters and on points of eligibility, such as academic performance at any point of the contest. Such rulings are final.
